Conference Program at a Glance

Nurses are the main and largest component, accounting for almost 50% of the global health workforce (WHO, 2018). For this reason, nurses are in a strong position to influence positive outcomes for the client's health status. Nursing as a profession is demanded to develop its knowledge as a form of caring in improving the welfare of mankind both in the preclinical and clinical levels. To be able to develop their knowledge, nursing is required to be sensitive to changes that occur in their environment at any time. It also can not be separated from the existence of various changes such as medical equipment technology, variations in the types of diseases and nursing intervention techniques. The various changes that occur will lead to various trends and issues that demand increased nursing care services.

The World Health Organization (WHO, 2018) explained that there is a shortage of global health workers, especially nurses who represent more than 50% of the current shortage of health workers. The biggest shortage of need-based nurses is in Southeast Asia and Africa. For all countries to achieve the Sustainable Development Goal 3 on Health and Wellbeing, WHO (2018) estimates that the world will need an additional 9 million nurses by 2030.

Nurses play an important role in health promotion, disease prevention and providing primary care in the community. Nurses will be key in achieving universal health coverage. Investing in improving the quality of nurses provides the best value for a country's finances. The report of the United Nations High Level Commission on Health Employment and Economic Growth concludes that investment in education and job creation in the health and social sectors results in a threefold increase in public health, globally safe health services, and economic growth.

Some of the facts above are a big challenge to prepare qualified nurses in both the research and clinical settings. The Nursing Conference, 5th ICON 2019, is a good opportunity to disseminate our achievements in the field of nursing, add to the body of knowledge and contribute to professional development towards global nursing through superior and competent research and clinical practice. This conference provides an opportunity to advance participants' understanding and skills regarding evidence-based practice, improving service quality and research.

SPEAKER PROFILES

1. Associate Professor Nongnut Boonyoung

Dr Boonyoung is currently an Associate Professor and the Dean of School of Nursing, Prince of Songkla University, Thailand. Before starting her career in academia, she had been a staff nurse in ICU at Songklanagarind Hospital for almost seven years. She also had become elected Committee of Thailand Nursing Midwifery Council from 2014 - 2018. Her doctoral degree was granted from University of Washington at Seattle, USA. She has two master degrees granted from University of Washington at Seattle, USA and Mahidol University, Thailand. Several awards had been achieved including the Recipient for an Exempla in Academic Service Award at Faculty Level in 2009, the Recipient for an Impressive Teacher at Faculty Level in 2010 and also the Recipient for Good Advisor of Doctoral Student in 2010.

2. Professor Carolina D. Weller

Professor Weller is currently the Director Wound Research Unit and Professor at School of Nursing and Midwifery and School of Public Health, Monash University, Australia. She is also the Visiting Professor at National University of Ireland and Royal College of Surgeons Ireland. Professor Weller is also currently the research director and NHMRC TRIP fellow at the School of Nursing and Midwifery. Professor Weller trained as a nurse specialising in emergency medicine and wound care. In addition to her clinical qualifications in nursing and extensive contributions to higher education and health policy, Prof Weller completed her PhD in Epidemiology and Preventive Medicine investigating healing outcomes in people with chronic wounds. She is one of Australia's leading researchers with a focus on cardiovascular disease, wound management, quality improvement and translation into clinical practice. She is recognised internationally for her epidemiological and health service research approaches. Prof Weller has extensive experience in teaching, course development and coordination in Evidence Based Practice, Quantitative Research Designs and Methods, Research Strategy, Leadership and Wound Management across health disciplines.

3. Dr Sarena Haji Hashim

Dr Hashim is currently a Nursing and Midwifery Lecturer with Post Graduate Teaching in Technical Education and 1.5 years' research degrees in Master of Professional Education and a Doctorate at Pengiran Anak Puteri Rashidah Sa'adatul Bolkliah Institute of Health Sciences, Universiti Brunei Darussalam. Her doctoral degree was granted from Monash University, Australia while her master degree was granted from University of Western Australia. She has several research experience focusing on maternal health and interprofessional education.

4. Associate Professor John Faustorilla

Dr Faustorilla is currently an associate professor as well as an auditor, systems and nurse informatician at University of the Philippines Manila College of Medicine. His doctoral degree was granted from St Paul University Philippines. Dr Faustorilla's professional objective is to work with an organization that values the triple bottom line and would work towards Integrated Management Systems. 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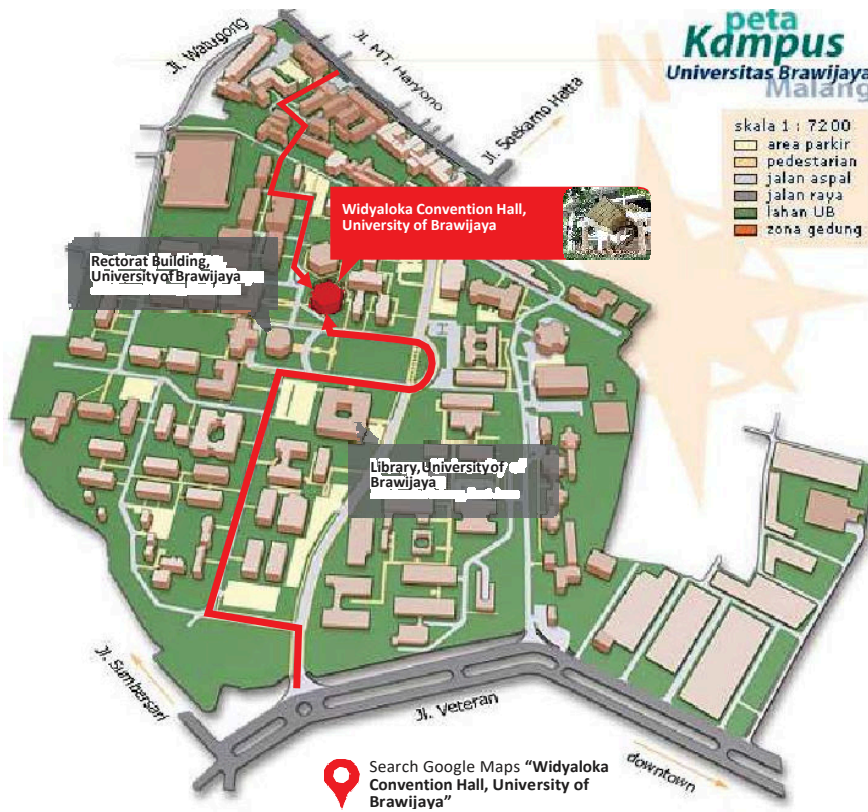
